Guideline for resuming research activities with preventing COVID-19 in Uji campus

Uji campus COVID-19 emergency Headquarters

Objective

To resume research activities with minimizing the decline in function of Uji campus and its surrounding areas under the circumstance that COVID-19 infection is well controlled.

1. Principle

- Follow the Kyoto University's Policy on the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19)
- > Practice a "New lifestyle" announced by the government of Japan.
- Reduce risk of COVID-19 infection with controlling your behavior.
- Manage your health condition to prevent the COVID-19.

2. Attendance to the Campus

- Work and study at home as much as possible. (Online meetings, etc.)
- Lower the density of persons in your office or lab by a rotation workstyle etc.
- Avoid contact opportunities by flexible-time working and commuting by bicycle, car and etc. without using public transportations.

3. Office and Lab condition for preventing COVID-19

- Avoid the 3 Cs and sharing items and equipment.
- > Act to avoid the infection
 - ♦ Hand washing/disinfect your hands, coughing manner, keep the social distancing (about 2m), and ventilate rooms. Items, equipment and spots used by multiple people should be cleaned with disinfectant.
 - ♦ Sanitize hands before entering a room.
 - ♦ Discussions, seminars, and collaborative works with multiple people should be minimized. Online meetings recommended.
 - ♦ Limit the number of people staying in a room at the same time.
- ➤ Observe above mentioned protection when holding meetings. If it is difficult, consider postponement and cancellation of the meeting.
- > Follow advices from industrial physician and Environmental Safety Management Center.

4. Observe and manage member's health condition

Take your lab/office member's temperature and check their health condition every day. Record the data (or report it to your institute).

- ➤ If your lab/office member has a fever or other poor physical condition, make the person not to come to the Campus. Suggest the person to see a doctor and take an early medical check.
- ➤ Recommend your member to record their daily range of actions including using shared rooms.
- ➤ Request your member to report to your lab when they take a medical examination for COVID-19.

5. Event including research seminars

- > Consider below when holding small events (100 people or less) in addition to protections mentioned above.
- Take basic infection countermeasures to prevent the spread of infection.

 Avoid the 3Cs. Ventilate rooms, keep a social distancing, and limit the attendance of people. Be sure to wash hands with disinfectant and wear a mask.
- Require health observation before and after the event to the participants.
- > Follow advices by industrial physician, Environmental Safety Management Center and public health center.

- 7. How to return to lab or work after an infected person recovers
 - ➤ Infected person and close-contact person: Follow the Kyoto University's Policy on the Novel Coronavirus (COVID-19).
 - ➤ The patient with cold-like symptoms:

 Follow the Guideline for returning to work for persons who standby at home with cold-like symptoms
- This guideline was made on May 21, 2020 after cancellation of declaration of a state of emergency.
 - Therefore, this guideline will be renewed by changing the policy of government and Kyoto University.
